Your Neighbors in the Pew: Denise Brouillette & Newell (Nick) Nichols

In 2020, Denise had turned 65 and the Covid pandemic had begun. Being eligible for retirement, she and Nick decided to move out of Florida. After several recent hurricanes, Nick said, "We need to move uphill." So the day after Denise's last day at work, the moving van came, and they were off to Tennessee.

Nick spent the first half of his childhood in South Dakota. He said his mom "found religion" and moved the family to Salt Lake City, Utah. He joined the US Marine Corps after high school and served his country in Vietnam as a radio operator/forward observer during the war.

After the Marines, he coached football at Utah's Westminster College as well as coached American football in Bari, Italy. Vince Lombardi said, "Success is based upon a spiritual quality and the power to inspire others." This describes Nick today for his faith is in the tenants of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Denise was born and raised in Rhode Island and baptized Catholic. She went to Boston University and graduated with a degree in occupational therapy. Although she interned in Colorado and California, Denise felt the Utah mountains were calling her and ended up in Utah which boasts "the greatest snow on earth" since she loved downhill skiing. While working for the VA hospital in Salt Lake City, Denise met Nick.

Denise mentioned casually a few weeks into dating that she could not go out that weekend as she had reserve duty. Nick's response was that he, too, had reserve duty. That is when they discovered they were both serving in the 328th General Hospital. It was meant to be, as they say, and they got married that year in a small chapel at Fort Douglas. Two months later, they were both activated for Desert Shield/Desert Storm and were deployed to Germany to serve for four months.

This brings us back to present day where Denise and Nick are both active in the Tellico Village community. Nick is a member of the Loudon County Honor Guard and American Legion motorcycle riders. He is a member of the Tellico Village Playhouse where he can be found volunteering with the sound crew when he's not acting on stage. Currently he is rehearsing with the Children's Readers Theater portraying a sasquatch among other characters.

Denise sings in four different groups, including the church choir, Tellico Singers, Tellico Voices, and Take 5. Take 5 is a small ensemble that sings for small gatherings, parties, Our PLACE, and at assisted living facilities. She also volunteers with the HOA Litter Angels.

They both enjoy riding Nick's trike, boating in the lake, and traveling—having just returned from Nick's surprise 80th birthday celebration on the seaside coast of North Carolina.
