## Your Neighbor in the Pew - Martha Wilkerson by Julie A. Best

"You've got to have some reason to go to bed at night and to get up in the morning." That's the advice that Martha Wilkerson gave her husband Worth when he retired. It's good advice, and it's wisdom that she embodies herself.

Martha was born into a family of four children in Western North Carolina. She was in the middle of the pack, and upon graduation from high school, she went to Greensboro College, which at that time was an all girls school. After one year there, she attended Brevard College. Brevard was a junior college, so upon completion of her second year of college, she enrolled at High Point College, now University. Martha has a great love for that school and the high standards that it maintains.

Martha graduated from High Point College with a degree in education. Her first position was teaching second graders in rural North Wilkesboro, NC. Martha is just a little slip of a lady, and she says when the class picture was taken for those second graders, the parents couldn't determine which one was the teacher!


Martha met Worth Wilkerson when they were both students at Brevard College. When their time at Brevard was up, Worth went west and south to Tuscaloosa, AL to attend the University of Alabama, and Martha went East to High Point College. So, it was a long distance relationship and it was the Post Office that kept them connected. They were married June 18, 1955 in Hendersonville, NC.

Worth was in journalism, and he worked for newspapers until he was employed by TVA. It was through Worth's job with TVA that they found Tellico Village. Worth had researched Cooper Communities, thought that they were a good company, and decided that Tellico Village would be a good place for them. However, the day they were to look at lots, Worth was tied up at work, so it was Martha who made the connection. It was early on in the development of the community and there were few roads. Martha and the realtor looked at lots on a four wheeler, and Martha selected a lot. It turned out to be a good selection - she has a beautiful view of the lake. She says, "This view is constantly changing with the seasons. I just love it!" They bought a lot early on, and moved here in September 1989.

Martha and Worth got involved with the church immediately upon moving here. In 1989, church was meeting at the Rec Center, and the choir consisted of 5-7 people! Music and art have been important components in Martha's life for as long as she can remember. From a very young age, she has been a part of a choir. And, she has always loved color, so art lessons were of interest to her.

Martha says, "Art is not a natural talent gifted to me. It is a technique that I have learned to use." And, she does a beautiful job of using her skills. For years, Martha has been the "Sunshine" person for our choir. When there is sickness, death, or any special need, Martha makes a beautiful card for that individual. Martha says, "I look upon my card making as a ministry. I use the skills and techniques that I have learned to make cards that encourage others. Each card is different, and I make it to 'fit' the person."

Worth died a few years ago, but Martha continues on. She has a purpose and a meaning for going to bed at night and for getting up in the morning. She has blessed so many folks with the use of her skills and abilities as she share the love of Christ with others. Thank you, Martha. You are a blessing!

My life has been overflowing with Psalm 23 as I've prepared for our sermon series. A classic book on the psalm is *A Shepherd Looks at Psalm 23* by W. Phillip Keller. Keller spent many years as an actual shepherd and offers numerous insights into the psalm. He shares personal stories of sheep going astray and how he sought after them. Keller

helped me understand at a deeper level the amount of preparation a shepherd does before taking the herd anywhere. His book made me more grateful we have a God who is our Good Shepherd!

I've also been reading *The Lord is My Courage* by K.J. Ramsey. Ramsey's memoir walks through Psalm 23 verse by verse as she unpacks spiritual abuse and religious trauma she experienced while working for a church. Ramsey is a licensed therapist and weaves theological reflection and practical neuroscience throughout her book to better understand the hope and healing we have in God. This book deals with heavy topics, but instead of been depressing, it makes the goodness of God more powerfully real. Ramsey has insights into the psalm I haven't discovered anywhere else. It's a good read if you are interested in Psalm 23 or healing from trauma.

Finally, for a book club, I read the memoir, *Wild* by Cheryl Strayed. The book has been made into a movie starring Reese Witherspoon, but I haven't seen it yet. At twenty-two Cheryl Strayed's life is a complete mess. Her mom had died, she briefly used heroin, and she blew up her first marriage by committing infidelity from the pain of it all. She decided to hike more than a thousand miles of the Pacific Crest Trail to regain a handle on who she was. I enjoyed Cheryl's humor and appreciated her unflinching portrait of her grief over the death of her mom. I thought her grit and determination were incredible. This is a good read if you want to be inspired or love hiking/memoirs.



Two mission partners were recipients of spaghetti and breakfast casseroles Friday, August 19. Facilities Manager, Jeff McDaniel, noticed that the freezer was failing to maintain the temperature for safe frozen food storage. Kitchen Manager, Lee Rook, and kitchen volunteer, Caroline Marney, quickly turned a possible loss into a blessed event.

Straightway Ministry founder, Bob Hampton, readily accepted the offer of multiple pans of frozen casseroles, noting that his wife, Lisa would be especially appreciative, as she cooks for the staff and residents.

Straightway Ministry provides an affordable Christian transition house for men who have been drug and/or alcohol addicted. Men pay their own way, attend church 3 times a week, attend daily group meetings, complete 5 bible summaries per week, complete daily housing chores, and maintain employment. The facility is in Athens.



Caroline Marney delivered the frozen casseroles to Beauty for Ashes Ministries located in Lenoir City. Director, Becky Steil, demonstrated her appreciation for the gift of food by taking Caroline on a tour of the facilities. This faith-based ministry provides 24/7 housing during an 8 to 12-month in-patient program for women in addiction. Women attend church services, receive mental health services, attend 3 classes every day including bible, parenting, anger management, re-fit, and much more.

We are so grateful to be able to help these Mission Partners in their ministry and we are thankful that our freezer is back up and running!

Next month will we be kicking off the 2023 Stewardship Campaign. Here are some thoughts to help you prayerfully consider your pledge:

King David declared "I will not offer burnt offerings to the Lord my God that which costs me nothing." (2 Samuel 24:24). David understood that the **value of the gift presented to God is determined by its value to the giver.** The greater the gift's value and significance to the giver, the greater its worth before the Heavenly Father. The gift that would touch the heart of God must first touch the life of the giver! "If it is for my God, my gift must have meaning and value to me."

This is defined as "**Lifestyle Giving**". A level of giving that affects me; my plans, my activities, my attitude, and my approach to life. It means giving up something in one area so that I can give more of myself in spiritual priorities. The three keys to effectiveness in Lifestyle Giving are:

- Reassess lifestyle
- Rearrange priorities
- Reallocate resources.
