CCTV calls new Associate Pastor, Rev. Dr. Katie Morgan-Harper

On February 11 as part of the annual church meeting, the congregation unanimously voted to call Rev. Dr. Katie Morgan-Harper as the new Associate Pastor for the Community Church at Tellico Village. It was a busy day for Pastor Katie and her husband, Matt beginning with a welcome breakfast in the CLC. Pastor Katie gave the opening prayer and introduced herself to the congregants in attendance. She and Matt then walked from table to table to say hello to everyone.

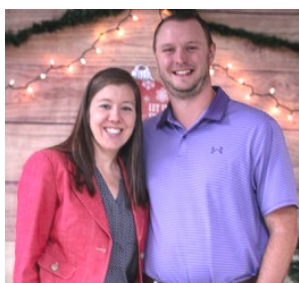
During worship, Pastor Katie preached and provided some additional introductory comments for people to get to know her a bit better. She has been involved in church all her life and felt the call to ministry at a very early age. The daughter of a high school coach, Katie credits sports, namely basketball, as a second influence in her life. The annual business meeting was held directly following worship where Leslie Shuman, Associate Pastor Search Team leader, summarized the process used by the team to discern the best candidate for CCTV. She put forth the nomination for a congregational vote which was passed unanimously.

Pastor Katie is returning to full-time pastor-

al work after nearly 3 years as an interim at a Presbyterian Church in Sweetwater. She has also served two Methodist congregations there prior to this position. Throughout this time, she has worked as a teacher, first for McMinn County schools and most recently as a 6th grade ELA and Social Studies teacher at Athens Middle School.



Rev. Dr. Morgan-Harper earned her undergraduate degree in International Missions and Children's ministry from Tennessee Wesleyan University, her Masters of Divinity from Duke Divinity School and her Doctor of Ministry in Arts and Theology from Wesleyan Theological Seminary. She was ordained in May of 2012 and served the McLean Baptist Church in McLean, VA prior to returning to east Tennessee.



Pastor Katie was recognized as an Outstanding Alumnus of Tennessee Wesleyan in 2021 and was named as one of McMinn's Top 20 under 40 also in 2021. In her leisure time, she enjoys reading, is passionate about art, loves to travel and also enjoys time at home with her husband, Matt and their golden doodle, Lucy.

Walt and Deb Marshall were born and raised in southwest Pennsylvania. Deb lived in the little community of Dry Tavern. Tidbit of information: supposedly, it was the only dry stop on the Pony Express route! Walt's family lived in Swissvale, PA, a suburb of Pittsburgh, which is on the way to Kennywood, the best amusement park (another info tidbit)! They met when they were both students at Indiana University of Pennsylvania - IUP, located in Indiana, Pennsylvania. (I learned that IUP has absolutely nothing to do with the state of Indiana!) Deb was a secondary English education major and Walt's degree was in business management.

Walt and Deb married and moved to Canton, Ohio where Walt was the manager of a retail clothing store. There were no teaching positions available for Deb, and that really didn't matter because she was soon expecting their first child, a son, and that was her major focus. A promotion took them to Milwaukee, Wisconsin and their second child, a daughter, joined the family. 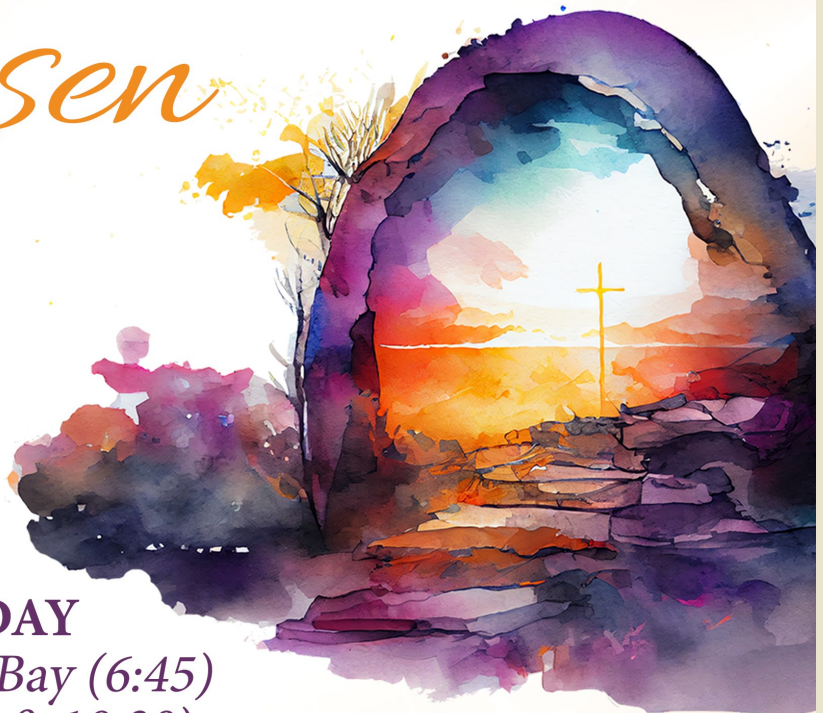

When people go through a crisis, many things happen. Depending on how serious a crisis it is or how devastating will determine how they react. Some people have voiced afterwards that it was like living in a fog. I've heard others describe that they were just on automatic and don't remember details, especially in the early onset of the crisis. A few took everything in stride. Some people's faith was strengthened, while others not only was it tested, but they even questioned God himself. All of these are normal responses.

This month as we journey through the Lenten season, I have been thinking of those who were the closest to Jesus and how they reacted, especially through Holy Week. Emotions were joyous when Jesus rode into Jerusalem, but that quickly changed as the week wore on. Scripture tells us that people who were the closest to him like his disciples, experienced many different emotions and behavior. Those emotions ranged from denying him, not guarding and staying awake in the garden of Gethsemane, and of course betrayal. They also must have suffered emotions such as guilt, fear for their own life and grief.

I have often heard the expression "it is the darkest before dawn." That was certainly true for the family and friends of Jesus. After Jesus's death on the cross, Good Friday was anything but good. It was the hardest day of their lives; but on Easter morning when they heard that Jesus was not in the tomb and remembered what he said about rising from the grave, then the darkest time started to turn. It gave them hope in the midst of their grief.

Sometimes what we need when we are going through a crisis is hope. Just like the disciples, we need the support of our friends who will be there for us, listening and caring. Wondering what the easiest way is to give to the church? We currently have five options:

- **Mail** – You can mail in a check to 130 Chota Center Loudon, TN 37774
- **Drop Off** – Bring your gift to the church office (Mon-Thurs, 9-4)
- **Sundays** – Place your gift in an offering plate
- **Online** – Visit the church website (tellicochurch.com) and click on Give. On the next screen there will be a button which says, “Click Here to Give Online.” You now can set up a (1) one-time or (2) recurring donation. You will use the drop-down screen to select the fund you would like to give to. Next, put in the dollar amount you would like to give. Once completed, the payment information will appear where you can enter your debit or credit card information. It will also give you the option to add an additional 2.5% to help cover the processing fee. While this is not necessary, it is appreciated.
- **Recurring withdrawal from your checking account** – Contact Cathy Bradley for an ACH and Credit Card Authorization Form. Fill it out and return with a void check. You will be gifting hassle free for the year.

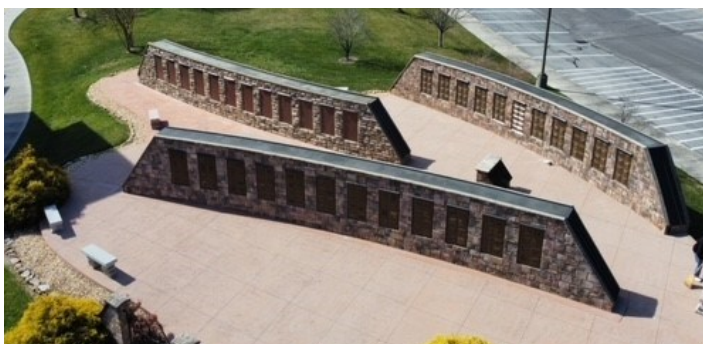
