Unwritten: Faith for the Road Ahead ***A Six-Week Sermon Series Beginning August 2***



One of the things I love most about the Bible is that it refuses to pretend people have it all together. Its pages are filled with ordinary men and women who experienced moments of great faith and moments of profound failure. They made courageous decisions, but they also made heart-breaking mistakes. They knew joy and sorrow, confidence and doubt, victory and defeat. In other words, they were just like us.

Beginning this August, I hope you'll join us for a brand-new six-week sermon series: ***Unwritten: Faith for the Road Ahead***. Together, we'll spend six Sundays exploring the lives of some of Scripture's most fascinating people. We'll meet individuals who stood at crossroads, wrestled with difficult choices, experienced both triumph and disappointment, and discovered that God's grace was greater than their failures. While the details of their lives may be ancient, their stories are remarkably familiar. In many ways, they are our stories too.

The central conviction behind this series is simple: **your story is not finished**. It's easy to believe that our past has already determined our future. We replay old regrets. We wonder if we've missed our opportunity. We fear that a poor decision, a painful season, or a difficult chapter has somehow become the final word.

But thanks be to God, the Gospel tells a different story! God has always been in the business of writing new chapters.

Throughout Scripture, we meet people who thought their best days were behind them, only to discover that God wasn't finished with them. Time and again, God brought hope where there was despair, purpose where there was confusion, forgiveness where there was failure, and new life where people assumed the story had ended. The same God who was writing their stories is still writing ours.

My prayer is that over these six weeks, you'll discover something about your own journey through the lives of these biblical men and women. Together we'll laugh, reflect, wrestle with difficult questions, and be reminded that God's grace has a remarkable way of meeting us exactly where we are. Whether you're celebrating a season of joy, carrying a burden, or simply wondering what God has in store next, I believe you'll find encouragement in God's Word.

I hope you'll make plans to join us each Sunday as we begin our summer series. Invite a friend. Come with your questions. Come with an open heart. Because every day we are making choices that shape tomorrow, and by the grace of God, the next chapter has not yet been written. I can't wait to discover together what God has in store for us.

Your Neighbors in the Pew: Cheryl & Jon Nametz

Cheryl and John Nametz were born and raised in St. Louis, Michigan, in the area known to Michiganders as “the middle of the mitten.” Cheryl was raised Methodist and John grew up Missouri Synod Lutheran. The summer before 7th grade, they both attended a summer camp. John went home and announced to his mother that he found the girl he would marry someday and her name was Cheryl.

Their first date was their sophomore year at the memorable “Winter Ball.” Thus began their lifelong relationship, and soon after this date John’s class ring sealed the deal. After graduation from high school, Cheryl attended Michigan State University. John was awarded a full Presidential scholarship to The University of Olivet. He had already established himself as an excellent student and basketball player. His Olivet University basketball team won three consecutive conference titles while he was on the team. Even though Cheryl and John attended different universities, they were only about 30 miles apart. This short distance proved to be a workable solution for the high school sweethearts. Together they spent many weekends watching their relationship grow alongside their academic interests. John graduated with a major in biology and a minor in math and chemistry. Cheryl earned her degree in special education, with her major focus of teaching students with blindness and visual impairments. Cheryl and John tied the knot at Peace Lutheran Church in Alma, Michigan on August 3, 1974. They then moved to Columbus, OH where John earned his Doctor of Optometry degree and Cheryl earned her Masters in Early Childhood Education at The Ohio State University.

John began his career as an optometrist in Charlotte, Michigan. Five years later he bought a practice in Spring Lake, Michigan on the Lake Michigan lakeshore where he continued for 34 years. Along with his clinical practice, he served as an adjunct professor for Ferris State University/ College of Optometry, providing on-site instruction and supervision to student interns who treated incarcerated patients at several Michigan correctional facilities.

Cheryl taught while they lived in Charlotte and continued her teaching career after moving to Spring Lake, where she worked for over 30 years serving an area of nine school districts. She was committed to helping her students with visual impairments grow from infancy all the way through graduation. Even now, she keeps in contact with many of her former students.

Amidst the hustle of busy careers, their family life blossomed with the blessing of two beautiful daughters, Lindsay and Abigail. Cincinnati is now home to their daughters and families. Lindsay followed in her Mom’s footsteps, teaching students with blindness and visual impairments. Abigail is a registered nurse and manages a pain management surgery center. John and Cheryl are “Nana and Bampa” to 5 grandchildren and feel so blessed that they can visit them often in one Ohio-bound trip to the Cincinnati area.

Tellico Village seemed like a great place for John and Cheryl to retire. With lots of golf, good weather, community activities (plus Cheryl’s sister and husband live here), it was easy to see the appeal of Tellico. It’s away from the Michigan lake effect snow and closer to their children and grandchildren. Their faith, family, and friends confirmed this was the right place to be. Cheryl and John are committed to staying healthy. Working out is an important daily routine and there are so many opportunities from walking in the neighborhood to working out at the Wellness Center and Chota. John loves to renovate and work on special projects. He has committed many hours to community groups, chiefly Smoky Mountain Service Dogs. He also gives much of his time to the church, serving as a shepherd and head usher. Cheryl and John both enjoy being active with activities that include golfing and boating. Cheryl also ushers at church and enjoys trying new recipes, reading and her book club. When it comes to serving the church, it’s clearly a family affair for the couple.

In the United States, 1 in 4 teens and 1 in 3 adults face difficulties affording period products, especially among lower-income and minority groups. In other nations around the world, this affects women and girls at a much higher rate, disrupting daily life, education, and work opportunities. Using unhygienic alternatives can cause infections and other health complications.

FINANCE NEWS - Investments

Several members from the Finance Team, Investment Committee and Endowment Team met with Chad Schol-laert from The Trust Company of Tennessee for the annual review of our investments with them. Year-to-date we have received a return of 7.09% on our investments. As a not-for-profit the funds continue to be invested conservatively in 70% equities and 30% fixed income.



This year, due to the generosity of two of our congregants, we were able to set-up two new investment accounts for scholarships:

- the Dr. James L and Helen S. Nicholson Education Scholarship for students attending a four-year college studying education, and
- the John and Alyce Fleishman Scholarship Fund for students going into 2-year vocational training or healthcare programs.
